

Confidential high-level dialogue contributes to deepening cooperation between Uzbekistan and Italy



A conference organized by the Institute for Strategic and Regional Studies under the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan (ISRS) and the Mediterranean Institute for Asia and Africa on “Uzbekistan – Italy: New horizons of cooperation” kicked off in Tashkent.

In his welcoming speech at the event, the ISRS First Deputy Director Akramjon Nematov presented a comprehensive analysis of Uzbekistan – Italy relations, paying particular attention to the prospects for developing cooperation between the two countries.

“Italy is the first EU country to launch a special format of dialogue with Central Asia “5+1” to promote a regional approach that considers the specific problems and internal issues of development of the five Central Asian states”, the expert emphasized.
